Mary is Professor of History in QUB and the author of a number of works on pre-Union Ireland. Her most recent book on A History of Women in Ireland. 1500-1800 was published in 2016.

Professor Michael Laffan. "The Death and Burial of Daniel O'Connell". Michael is professor emeritus of history at UCD. He has written a number of acclaimed books, especially on the foundation of the State. He recently published the authoritative biography of William T. Cosgrave which was published under the auspices of the Royal Irish Academy.
